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Block Rotation Notes

Each block is four weeks; split blocks consist of two 2-week blocks

Rotation names with a slash (e.g. Wards/NF) indicate the resident is assigned either to the first rotation name or to the second rotation name

Rotation shorthand name key:

- Amb – outpatient/ambulatory internal medicine
- Bmed – behavioral medicine inpatient service
- Elect – elective
- GIM – general internal medicine; alternating weeks of inpatient wards senior resident and outpatient/ambulatory internal medicine
- CICU – cardiovascular ICU
- Geri – geriatrics clinical experience
- MAO – medical admission officer for inpatient internal medicine service
- NF – night float for inpatient internal medicine service
- Pall – palliative medicine inpatient service
- Team H – hospitalist-like rotation working one-on-one with academic hospitalist
- Wards – inpatient internal medicine service

Up to three weeks of vacation per year can be taken during any elective time or ambulatory rotation as a one- or two-week block.

Elective options are listed below. All except away rotations and geriatrics are at CAMC. Asterisks denote core electives each resident must complete during residency. All electives are 4 weeks unless otherwise noted. Core electives highlighted in yellow can be either 2 or 4 weeks, whichever the resident chooses (limit of three 2-week rotations per resident). The percentage of time devoted to outpatient activities in these specialties varies from 0% (e.g. CICU) to 100% (e.g. emergency medicine), with core elective inpatient and outpatient time specified below. All electives except research blocks are clinical and do not include dedicated research time. Research blocks include 0% inpatient time, 10% outpatient time, and 90% research time.
